## APOLOGIES

• Apologies were received in advance from Cllr Maynard due to other commitments and Cllr Winslow due to illness. Cllr Fletcher proposed and Cllr Powell seconded accepting the apologies. All in favour.

## **CHAIR'S REPORT**

• Chairman McMillan welcomed the Councillors and members of the public. He outlined where Fire exits and extinguishers were situated, where to assemble in an emergency, that the building was a "No smoking" establishment and that the Council policy folder was available at the rear of the hall. Councillor McMillan welcomed the representatives from Phillips66.

## MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

• Had been previously circulated. It was proposed by Cllr Fletcher and seconded by Cllr Holden to accept the Minutes. Vote to accept all in favour. These be adopted as a true record'.

## **OPEN FORUM**

• Steve Danter and Mike Tinsley attended on behalf of Phillips66 to give update on pipeline project. Marine permits /licences from DEFRA, harbour works consent from ABP and planning permission from ELDC have all been granted. Principle contractor has been hired – Van Oord from Holland. Working closely with RSPB, Environment Agency and Natural England. 70% of dredging of channels completed and being monitored for refill. Work has started on beach side of works. 15-20 people building an 80m x 30m safe haven for all land vehicles at high tide. All equipment/vehicle transported to site by sea. 2 barges to be beached on sands. 1 will be for accommodation of workers and the second barge will be used for storage of equipment and pipes. Barges will be visible from Cleethorpes and an article will be published in the Grimsby Telegraph explaining the presence of the barges and the project. Works area must be fenced off from public by law for safety reasons. Full shutdown of refinery at Killingholme will start on 8th May until 12th July. Monobuoy not in use during shutdown so will be placed in dry dock in Hull for maintenance checks. Pipe line has to be up and running by 12<sup>th</sup> July deadline. Drones have been flown over the site many times to measure and map beach levels and the topography. All beach based equipment will be removed by 12<sup>th</sup> July. Beach to be reinstated to original state by mid August. 380m section of exposed pipeline to be removed. Remaining old pipeline to be capped off. Working hours currently daylight hours only however will be 24 hours by April. Noise limits have been imposed on planning application. 9m high sea wall will help to reduce noise. Limits set at 65dba Mon - sat am, 47dba between 11pm - 7am and 55dba on sat pm and all Sunday. 2 noise receptors to be located at 2 nearest residential properties. RSPB and Natural England requested an independent Ecological Clerk of works be employed to ensure the environment and wildlife are looked after. The on-shore pipe is fine and is easily accessible if needed with regular maintenance checks carried out.

## 16. CEMETERY, CHURCHYARD AND JUBILEE GARDENS

Contractor has cut the boundary hedge at Jubilee Gardens. Contractor would like to re-seed grass area under the hedge and to put additional woodchip at the rear of the war memorial down to the hedge. All agreed this was acceptable. Clerk to inform the Contractor to go ahead. Parish Council to pay for the seed and woodchip. To mark the 95<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the WI, they would like to donate and plant £50 worth of plants to Jubilee Gardens. The Parish Council agreed and suggested placing the plants along both sides of the path leading up to the memorial.

### **17. ALLOTMENTS**

Allotment rent increase letter received from Jas. Martin. Cllr Powell to negotiate the increase. Parish allotment rent reviewed, an increase to £20 full size/£10 half size, proposed by Cllr Lukehurst and seconded by Cllr McMillan.

Townpiece to be increased to £165 per annum, Brickpits to increase to £66 per annum and remaining allotment field to increase to £1260 (dependent on rate negotiated) proposed by Cllr McMillan and seconded by Cllr Fletcher. Vote taken – unanimously agreed.
